### **Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium:**

ALL pupils leaving primary school are physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

It is expected to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of ALL pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

### **School Development Plan Targets:**

**Aim:** To demonstrate a progressive and well-sequenced curriculum that allows children to know and remember more

**Priority 1:** We engage and inspire learners through purposeful, well sequenced lessons; preparing children for the next stage of their learning
