Dear Parents/Carers,

Home Learning

As you will be aware, the Year 6 children may have already started to receive home learning. We wanted to write to you to make you aware of all the home learning which the children will be receiving and some key information related to this.

Compared to previous years, the amount of home learning which the Year 6 children will be receiving is increasing. This is to help prepare the children for their SATs, whilst also further preparing them for High School, where there will be a greater amount of home learning to complete. Below is a table which shows all the home learning which the Year 6 children will be expected to complete, including the day that it will be set and the day that it should be completed by.

If a child doesn't complete their home learning or does not return it on time, they will be asked to attend a lunchtime Home Learning Club. The club, which will last for up to 30 minutes, will be an opportunity for children to catch up on any home learning which hasn't been completed, whilst also receiving some additional support and guidance which may be required with the home learning itself. If a child attends the Home Learning Club, they will of course still have time to eat their lunch and have some time on the playground.

Reading at home

Reading logs are to be returned every Friday. These can be filled in by the children but must be signed by an adult. Children should be reading at home at **least 5 times a week for 20-30 on each occasion**. We encourage parents to read with their child as often as possible, hear them read, read to them and question them along the way to ensure that they are reading for meaning. Please also encourage your child to read a variety of texts, including fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

Assessment Papers

During the course of the year, there will be occasions when the children take various assessments. The outcomes from these assessments provide additional information which we can then use to further support the children's learning. We will be sending completed assessments home as you may also wish to further support your child with aspects of their learning. The answers to the tests are all available online.
